## The Teacup Story

One day in this beautiful shop they saw a beautiful cup. They said, "May we see that? We've never seen one quite so beautiful."

As the lady handed it to them, suddenly the cup spoke. "You don't understand," it said. "I haven't always been a teacup. There was a time when I was red and I was clay. My master took me and rolled me and patted me over and over and I yelled out, 'let me alone,' but he only smiled, 'Not yet.'

## Time

Was there ever a time when time did not exist? Are our concepts of time and also of space valid, and in harmony with the Word of God? We read Genesis 1:1 "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth". The next verse declares the earth was "without form and void, and darkness covered the earth". Therefore there was a time between the creation of this planet and the time when God began the week of creating life on it. Nothing is said as to the length of this period, and any attempt to define it is sheer speculation. Time, as we know it, depends on the relationship of the sun, moon, and earth to each other. A day is defined as the duration of one rotation of this planet relative to the position of the sun. A month is related to the phases of the moon, and a year relates to the duration of complete orbit of the earth around the sun. We have arbitrarily divided a day into equal segments of 24 hours, and to each hour assigned 60 minutes. Each minute is similarly divided into 60 seconds. Until recent years, a second was a small enough length of time to satisfy our knowledge quests. Now we have divided seconds by powers of ten, and speak of microseconds, and even nanoseconds when studying such topics as nuclear physics. Before the creation week there was no light, no sun, to define a day. And, without life, there was no need to have the gift of time.

Will there be need of time after $2^{\text {nd }}$ coming? We often sing a hymn titled: When the Roll is Called Up Yonder (page 218 of the SDA Hymnal), and the words of the first verse say: "When the trumpet of the Lord shall sound and time shall be no more" we assume that time will end. We speak of the end time, or time of the end, but do we know that time will end? I am not sure. My Bible speaks of God as above time, saying (2 Peter 3:8, and Psalms 90) that one day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. God is from everlasting to everlasting, and time to Him is not the same as it is to mankind. We are slaves to time, and servants of it. It is essential to our social activities and well being. It is a gift from God yet we take it for granted. CT 354 states: "Good grants men the gift of time for the purpose of promoting His glory".

When we get to heaven, and in the light of eternity, will time have any meaning? Here on earth we time our activities to a short stay of perhaps 70 years, with additional days merely a bonus. Our education and most of our choices all depend on this fact. Eccl. 3 tells us there is a time for most everything we say or do. But with an infinite future, time becomes unimportant.

I searched the concordances to find a Bible verse which would tell me when time began, but was unsuccessful. In fact, the more I studied the subject of time, the more it became apparent I was floundering around in an ocean of the great unknown. And God was probably laughing at my impertinence and impudence. We hang our heads in shame at our stupidity and ignorance but look with hope in heaven when we will learn the secrets God is eager for us to grasp. Praise Him for His unspeakable love.
